Individual cancer screenings		Individual cancer screenings are conducted at designated medical institutions in Nisshin from June through November. Screening Tickets were sent at the end of May to people aged 40 or older and to people receiving municipal medical screening reminders. *Screening tickets will be enclosed with the leaflet for the Specific Health Checkups for those enrolled in the National Health Insurance System or Medical System for those aged 75 or older.			
Health checkup for those in their 30s		Health checkups for those in their 30s are conducted at designated medical institutions in Nisshin from June through November. Some people will receive screening tickets without application. Refer to the Nisshin City website.			
Routine Vaccination		Pneumococcal vaccination for the elderly (Notifications will be sent to persons eligible for the vaccination) and the additional vaccination for Rubella (Notifications were sent to persons eligible for the vaccination)			
Subsidy for Arbitrary Vaccinations		Expenses for the following arbitrary vaccinations will be partially subsidized; pneumococcus, rubella, and herpes zoster (shingles). Each type of vaccination has its conditions for receiving the subsidy. Contact the Health Promotion Div.(Health Center) for details.			

NOTE: Some screenings are not available depending on the examinee's health conditions. For further information, please call the Health Promotion Div. (Health Center) or refer to the Nisshin City website or the Health Center Guidebook. People in municipal tax-exempt households or households receiving welfare benefits are exempted from the fees of the examinations at the Health Center, osteoporosis screening and fluoride coating on teeth. September is the Disaster Prevention Month

Prepare against earthquakes

(9月は防災月間です)

An earthquake may occur anytime, anywhere. We should prepare against earthquakes in our daily life.

●Disaster Preparedness Map

Take a close look at “The Nisshin Disaster Preparedness Map” and know the risks that could affect your area in case of disasters. Check your nearest evacuation shelter and route to get there. You can download “the Nisshin Disaster Preparedness Map” via Nisshin City website or get a copy at the window of Disaster Prevention and Traffic Safety Div. in the city hall.

●Emergency stocks at home

Prepare so you can stay and evacuate at home in case of an earthquake or a natural disaster. Stock emergency supplies of food, water, daily necessities and household medicines for about one week or at least for three days at home. A simple way to create a stockpile is to start “daily stockpiling”, or “rolling stock”, in which you buy a little more of what you normally use and replace them with what you have consumed.

When you go to an evacuation shelter, you might want to bring face masks, soap, and disinfectants to prevent infection, a thermometer, slippers, and spare clothes, in addition to drinking water, food and daily necessities since there may be none or not enough at the shelter.

●What to Do in the Event of an Earthquake

In the event of an earthquake, stay calm and take steps to protect yourself. If your home is not safe to stay in and may take time to recover, go to an evacuation shelter opened at elementary and junior high schools.

Cooperation among evacuees (local residents) is vital for smooth operation of these shelters. Check and see how to set up and operate evacuation shelters. You can see Nisshin City's manual for setting up and operating a shelter on YouTube.
