@ Former Ichikawa Residence

The former Ichikawa residence is a valuable structure for learning the process of yotsudate (torii-date) style. It is this region's unique style of architecture in which four roof pillars are connected with crossbeams. The main house was registered as a national registered tangible property on December 24, 2013. Visitors may tour the residence for free and play with the traditional toys.

@ Nagoya City Tram & Subway Museum

This museum exhibits trams that used to run within Nagoya as well as subway carriages and bogies that operated during the opening of the Nagoya subway system in 1957, and visitors can go inside them. It also has a subway driving simulator that lets visitors play a subway driving game, a historical materials search corner where you can learn the history of the subway and more, and an exhibition corner that presents the history of Nagoya's trams.

@ Maspro Art Museum

This art museum exhibits approx 600 ukiyo-e woodblock paintings created in the late Edo and early Meiji periods, as well as old ceramics, including Mino ware, Seto ware, and Arita ware. Visitors can also see "Kasugai" ("Bakohan"), a flower-shaped celadon teacup that has immense historical value.

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@ Iwasaki castle Park (Iwasaki Castle and Iwasaki Castle Museum)

Iwasaki Castle is a flatland-mountain castle from the Muromachi period, said to have been built during the Kyoroku era (1528-1531). During the Battle of Komaki and Nagakute (1584), more than 300 people died here, and the castle tragically fell to the enemy. The observation deck was built in 1987, and there is a museum that exhibits historical and cultural artifacts from Nisshin, including materials from Iwasaki Castle.

@ Aichi Farm



@ Goshikien Park


This is a large religious park covering 66 hectares of land. Inside the park there are concrete statues that recreate the life of Shinran Shonin. The name "Goshikien", meaning "garden of five colors", refers to the five types of trees found in the park: pine, bamboo, plum, cherry, and maple; as you might expect from its name, the park is an enjoyable place to visit throughout the four seasons. There are lodging facilities within the park, so it can be used for workshops and overnight field trips.
